<u>July 18, 2020 Saturday (11 am) - 246th Commemoration of the Signing of the Fairfax Resolves</u>


Location: Virtual with small contingent at Pohick Church

Details: This Chapter-level event honoring the memory of the signers of the Fairfax Resolves. The Fairfax Resolves were a set of resolutions adopted by a committee in Fairfax County in the colony of Virginia on July 18, 1774, in the early stages of the American Revolution. Written primarily by George Mason, the resolutions rejected the British Parliament's claim of supreme authority over the American colonies. More than thirty counties in Virginia passed similar resolutions in 1774, "but the Fairfax Resolves were the most detailed, the most influential, and the most radical.
