





We have accomplished a lot in these two years coming out of a difficult period with Covid. We've celebrated two new events, the Skirmish at Kemp's Landing, and the Burning of Norfolk. Thomas Nelson, Jr. Wreath-Laying

Culpeper Memorial Ceremony

Chapter President Bob Bruce attended the Culpeper Minute Battalion Memorial Ceremony on October 21st at the Yowell Meadow Park in Culpeper, Virginia. William Schwetke, VASSAR Past President gave a presentation of the history of the Battalion and bios of several members were read. The ceremony included a musket volley.



Skirmish at Kemp's Landing

The chapter held a Commemoration of the 248th Anniversary of Skirmish at Kemp's landing on Saturday, November 4th at the Emmanual Episcopal Church, in Virginia Beach. The church is situated on the location of the Village of Kemp's Landing, the location of the 15 November 1775 skirmish.



The church graciously supported the ceremony providing available seating for the attendees. Over 40 individuals attended this event supported by fourteen patriotic organizations that presented wreaths in commemoration of the lives lost that day. Kemps Landing is important for a number of reasons, the skirmish marked the first Patriot deaths in the defense of the colony of Virginia. It also served as the location for Lord Dunmore, the royal governor, to issue his fa-



mous proclamation declaring martial law and offer to free indentured servants and slaves who would fight for the king.

Mr. James Carver, a Kempsville resident, reenactor and local Kemps Landing researcher and historian, served as the guest speaker. Of note, three descendants of the family of James Ackiss Jr., a member of the Princes Anne District Minute Bn, the only name of a Patriot killed in the action preserved in the historical record, attended the ceremony. Christopher Ackiss, the Secretary of the Richmond Chapter of the SAR presented a wreath. Other Ackiss family members included James Ackiss and Andrew Monahan.

Major Joseph Eggleston Commemoration

On Sunday, November 5th, the Grave Marking and Solemn Commemoration of Major Joseph Eggleston's Life and Patriotic Service was held at the Historic Grub Hill Church in Amelia, VA.

The service was sponsored by the Richmond Chapter, of the Sons of the American Revolution in



cooperation with Christ Episcopal Church of Amelia, The Amelia County American Revolution 250 Committee and the Amelia County Historical Society.

Eggleston was an American farmer, soldier, and politician from Amelia County, Virginia. Soon after grad-




uating from the College of William and Mary in 1776 he joined the Revolutionary Army serving in the cavalry. In the southern campaign against Colonel Tarleton, Captain Eggleston commanded the rear guard of Colonel Henry Lee's legion, and acquired the name of being one of the most efficient officers in the American cavalry. He was distinguished in the engagement at Guilford Court House in March 1781, and in the siege of Augusta in June of that year. The first success in the battle of Eutaw, in September 1781, was the attack by Major Eggleston on the advance of the British forces. After the war he was a member of the Virginia assembly for several years, and was also a representative in congress from Virginia, serving from 3 December 1798 to 3 March 1801. Chapter President Bob Bruce and Former President Ken Hawkins presented our wreath.

Veterans Day



Chapter President Bob Bruce, accompanied by his wife Cindy, presented the chapter wreath at Colonial Williamsburg's annual Veterans Day program on the Palace Green, which honors the men and women who have served in the United States Armed Forces. This stirring tribute was presented in partnership with the Williamsburg Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. Also in attendance was Vice-President Tim Ahlgrim

The Battle of Great Bridge



The Norfolk Chapter SAR and the Great Bridge DAR Chapters co-hosted the 248th Commemoration of the Battle of Great Bridge that took place on the battle-field on December 2nd with over 200 individuals in attendance. Wreaths were presented by over 50 different patriotic organizations from multiple states.



The guest speaker for this year's event was Jason Miyares, Virginia's current Attorney General. His well received and his deeply thoughtful message included comments about his mother's escape from communist Cuba and how that experience has influenced his perspective on the Patriots contributions to the freedoms we now enjoy. He also mentioned several of the Patriot soldiers who served during the battle that took place on December 9, 1775.

He highlighted the service of a young Lieutenant John Marshall of the Culpeper District Minute Bn. who would continue his revolutionary service and later serve the new nation as Virginia's Attorney General and later the Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. He also addressed the service of a young free black Patriot, William "Billy" Flora of the Princess Anne District Minute Bn. After the formal ceremony was completed, Attorney General Miyares took the time to speak with family members descended from Flora who attended the commemoration. Recent research uncovered, that for several months in the fall of 1778 during the restructure of

the Virginia Line, Captain John Marshall served as the acting company commander of William "Billy" Flora, reuniting these two Great Bridge veterans after three difficult years of war.



Graves




On 20 & 30 November 2023, Kimball Thompson & Pat Hannum installed grave markers on four different Patriot graves.

The first two soldiers. John Smith, Militia, & William Woodard, also spelled Woodward, 6th Virginia, are located in the Smith Family Cemetery, on the northeast corner of the Navy's Fentress Airfield in Chesapeake. A ceremony to dedicate these graves is planned for October 2024. Before a ceremony can be held at the location a bridge crossing a drainage ditch will need to be repaired and the cemetery cleaned of weeds and groomed. The Great Bridge Chapter SAR is coordinating with Scout Troop 6 for accomplishment of these tasks.

The 30 November installations marked the final resting place of two soldiers, Willis Wilkins and William West. Willis Wilkins is interred in a small family plot

in Deer Run Housing subdivision, adjacent to 2017 Coral Ivy Lane, Chesapeake. William West is interred at Good Hope United Methodist Church Cemetery, 1633 Benefit Road, Chesapeake. The sites are about 15 minutes apart. A ceremony to dedicate these graves is planned for April 2024.



Both ceremonies will be jointly sponsored by the Norfolk and Great Bridge chapters because the Great Bridge chapter now covers the entire City of Chesapeake.

The cost of purchasing and installing these markers is well over \$200 per soldier. If members have any have ideas for fundraising to support this program, please provide your thoughts to one of the chapter officers.

In Memory



Carter Branham Snow Furr, a lifelong resident of Norfolk, Virginia, died peacefully on October 6, 2023, having lived a remarkable life of almost 91 years.

Carter was born on October 30, 1932, the son of Marion Snow and Carlton Harris Furr. He attended Taylor Elementary, Blair Middle School, and Maury High School. Carter graduated Magna Cum Laude from Hampden-Sydney College in 1954 and received a juris doctorate in 1957, Order of the Coif, from the University of Virginia. He spent over 30 years in the Army Reserve JAG Corps, retiring as a Colonel. Carter practiced law for more than 60 years with partners and friends Arthur Jett and Waverly Berkley. Known nationally for expertise in maritime law, their firm, Jett, Berkley, and Furr, later merged with McGuire Woods.

In addition to many other organizations, Carter was a member of the Norfolk and Portsmouth Bar Associations, a member of the United States Court of Appeals Fourth Circuit Judicial Conference, and a permanent member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States. He also served as a board member of the Hampton Roads Naval Historical Foundation, past president of the Norfolk German Club, past president of the Virginia Club, and a member of the Advisory Council to the Virginia Commission on the Bicentennial of the American War of 1812.

Having a deeply rooted interest in historical and genealogical matters, Carter could proudly trace his ancestry back 40 generations as a member of the Order of the Crown of Charlemagne.

He served as the state chancellor and past president of the Norfolk Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, past president of the Order of First Families of Virginia, governor of the Jamestown Society, and a consultant to The Hereditary Society Community of the United States of America. He also held active membership in more than two dozen hereditary, preservation, and historical societies.

A devoted parishioner of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Carter was a former vestryman and twice served as senior warden. He was proud to be the oldest long-term member of the congregation.

Although never able to shoot his age, Carter was a dedicated golfer and an enthusiastic traveler who shared countless trips with his wife, Huffy, and a wonderful group of lifelong friends.

He was a passionate civil war historian, a faithful Wahoo, and a long-suffering Washington football fan. Carter loved any social event but was most at home on his deck at Sandbridge enjoying a cocktail and the sunset with his wife and family.

Carter was predeceased by his parents and by his brother, Carlton Harris Furr Jr. He is survived by his beloved and devoted wife of 61 years, Caroline Huffstutler "Huffy" Furr, son Carter Jr. and his wife Caroline, and grandchildren, Carter III, Kate, and Ann Randolph Furr, all of whom he deeply treasured.
