PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Welcome Compatriots, to our third issue of "Cipher." As we close the door to 2022, we look back on our first year since recharting with sincere appreciation for the camaraderie and fellowship we enjoyed as a new Chapter. I am pleased that many of you were able to participate in the numerous events throughout the year, whether through attendance at meetings, honoring public servants, recognizing veterans and, of course, paying homage to historic people and events of the Revolutionary War in Loudoun County. Through our combined efforts, we've established a strong base on which to continue our growth in 2023.

Without spilling the beans too early, I will tell you that our Chapter is competitive as a 'Best Chapter' among small chapters in the State and Nationally. I look forward to telling you more about the results from our efforts in 2022!

This year, we will continue to grow our already active Public Service and Veterans Committees and will put an emphasis on Youth Programs including recognizing a JROTC cadet at Loudoun High School and nominating candidates for the annual Essay and Poster/Brochure contests. We're also endeavoring to establish a partnership with Scouting in Loudoun, to recognize Eagle Scouts in the County.

For Historic Programs, we will mark the graves of at least three more Patriots at Nixon and Potts cemeteries in Leesburg and Hillsboro respectively and are partnering with the Fairfax Resolves Chapter and local historians to identify and recognize Patriots, buried at New Jerusalem Lutheran Cemetery in Lovettsville, through the erection of a monument.

The Chapter Board of Managers (BOM) will meet in early January to review and approve our budget and the calendar of events for 2023, and details of both will be communicated to the Chapter shortly. In the meantime, I'll draw your attention and invite your participation in several approaching events.

- The Virginia SAR 133rd annual meeting 10 12 February, at historic Berry Hill Resort in South Boston, Virginia; the first held in conjunction with an SAR nationally-recognized event, The Crossing of the Dan. The agenda, which I'll forward when available, includes impressive fireworks display on Saturday evening the 11th.
- We will hold our first Chapter meeting of the year in mid-February, targeting Saturday the 18th at 1 pm at the Loudoun Museum in Leesburg.

In State news, you should have received a message from President Bruce Meyer about the recent launch of "<u>Dispatch</u>," our new MemberClicks-based website and membership system. The site already has an abundance of information about the Virginia SAR and Color Guard calendar of events for 2023. When fully operational, we'll begin using this site to register for events, and pay annual dues.

I would like to express my appreciation here to Compatriot Rhett Wade, who crafted and donated a custom-designed box and patch knife, adorned with the Betsy Ross flag on the lid and an SAR rosette inside (see picture). This was raffled in the Fall and the winner, Compatriot Kelly Ford with the Col James Wood II Chapter in Winchester, was drawn at our Holiday Luncheon in December. The Chapter earned \$140 from this raffle! But there's more to come, and we'll soon unveil another of Rhett's handiworks to raffle this Spring. Thank you, Rhett, for the generosity of your donation to the Chapter!





Finally, I'm pleased to report that we've made key assignments to Steve Riddle as Treasurer (officer), Jim Watts as Chaplain (officer), and Rhett Wade as Chair of Public Service and Richard Ryan as Chair of Veterans (committees). If you're current or prior law enforcement, fire, or

EMS, you're already a member of the Public Service Committee. If you're a veteran, you're already a member of the Veterans Committee. We will identify candidates for Secretary (officer) and Youth Programs (committee), and at-large members of the BOM soon. COMMEMORATION OF THE BATTLE OF GREAT BRIDGE (sponsored by Norfolk Chapter VA SAR)

The two-hundred Forty-seventh Anniversary of the Battle of Great Bridge was commemorated in Chesapeake, VA on 3 December. This was the 122nd Annual Commemoration by the Great Bridge Chapter, NSDAR and the 12th annual Commemoration by the Norfolk Chapter, Virginia SAR. Because of inclement weather, the ceremony was moved indoors to the City of Chesapeake City Council Chamber. A planned musket volley was cancelled.

The Battle of Great Bridge took place 9 December 1775 and was a decisive victory for an army composed of Virginia "Regulars" and militia and Carolina militia. The victory resulted in the British evacuation of Norfolk with Lord Dunmore, the last British Royal Governor of Virginia, evacuating with the military and his staff.

Chapter Vice President Barry Schwoerer represented the Chapter by presenting the chapter wreath.
