No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

We will celebrate Veterans' Day with a ceremony at the Revolutionary War grave site behind the Palace at Colonial Williamsburg followed by lunch and a speaker at The Crowne Plaza.

Our celebration will begin at 11 AM on 11 **November.** Tom Campbell and volunteers will mark the grave sites with small American Flags. We will have Bob Schmidt's local color guard and a fifer and drummer from Colonial Williamsburg. We will also have a Colonial Williamsburg interpreter (Frank Mergargee) who will portray Richard Henry Lee. Wreaths will be laid by Elane Strange (Regent, Williamsburg DAR), Mark Brennan (President Elect, VASSAR), Jim Swords (President, Thomas Nelson Jr. Chapter, SAR) and myself. The ceremony should not exceed 30 minutes and will be followed by lunch at the Crowne Plaza.

Joe Spruill will shortly be issuing parking and other administrative instructions regarding the Palace Ceremony. We hope to have a shuttle service similar to the one we had on Memorial Day.

Our lunch will begin at 12:30... allowing time for movement from the Palace. We will present awards to the Firefighter of the year and Policeman of the year. Our speaker will be local resident Harry Walters. Harry was an honorable mention All American fullback on the last undefeated Army team. After a successful business career he served as Ronald Reagan's Assistant Secretary of the Army and as Administrator of the Veterans Administration (now a Cabinet Level Job).

Harry left government to be President/CEO of Great Lakes Carbon and went on to sell the company. He organized an ESOP (Employee Stock Options Plan) for Northwest Airlines. Harry organized a group comprised of members from the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans which studied health care and issued a report on that subject last year. His topic will be Health Care as it affects veterans and senior citizens. He might be persuaded to comment on December's Army/Navy game.

Finally, Jim Henry and his nominating committee have developed its slate of 2011 officers. His report follows in the newsletter.

The Historian's Corner

In his excellent presentation on the Battle of Cowpens at the October chapter meeting, Bill Simpson referred several times to Lt. Colonel John Eager Howard of the Maryland Line. So, to tailgate on those comments, this month's selection "From the Historian's Bookshelf" is entitled "Cool Deliberate Courage: John Eager Howard in The American Revolution" by Jim Piecuch and John Beakes, The Nautical and Aviation Publishing Co. of America, Charleston, SC, 2009.

Piecuch and Beakes tell us that from the early campaigns of the Revolutionary War in 1776 to the final battles in 1781, Lt. Colonel John Eager Howard of the Maryland Line built a reputation as an outstanding military leader. One author calls Howard "one of the finest regimental commanders in American history."

Howard participated in the New York campaign of 1776 and the Philadelphia campaign of 1777, led his Maryland troops as they fought tenaciously at the Battle of Camden, SC in 1780, and was awarded a Silver Medal by Congress for his performance at the Battle of Cowpens in 1781. He also served with distinction during the Race to the Dan and the Battles at Guilford Courthouse, Hobkirk's Hill and Eutaw Springs.

After the war, Howard held several important offices including Governor of Maryland and U.S. Senator. This is the first military biography of this distinguished soldier, and I highly recommend it for your reading.
