By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

The Chapter Registrar's Corner SAR APPS Online!

A few months ago NSSAR announced an agreement with Ancestry to digitize all SAR Applications prior to 1971. Ancestry has now completed this task. This new Database has 145,000 applications and 1.2 Million records. It is called "Sons of the American Revolution Membership Applications".

You can find it in the Category-Military Records. It will allow one to see if a particular Patriot Ancestor is in the database and all members who used that ancestor as their patriot. You can view each application complete with the applicant's lineage. Ancestry is a fee based company so you will need a subscription or you can go to the Williamsburg Library as they have a subscription for their patrons use. This is true for many libraries in the area.

To use the database log on to Ancestry and select "Search" from the menu at the top. This gives you a drop down menu. Select "Military" and click. Put in the keyword Sons and the dialog box at the left and it will go to that area of the list. Select the Sons database and you will get the Dialog Box to fill in to search for a name, either of a patriot or someone in his lineage.
