Williamsburg Chapter Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution



By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.



Crossing of The Dan Commemoration

On Saturday February 18th, Joe Spruill and Ed Truslow journeyed to South Boston, VA to the 7th Annual Crossing of the Dan Commemoration. The event memorialized Nathaniel Greenes's successfully leading the American Army across the Dan River on February 14, 1781 and thus bringing them out of reach of Lord Cornwallis' army. The American forces were saved to fight another day. There was a wreath laying ceremony, a fine luncheon and a reenactment of Americans crossing the river with British forces in pursuit.

Well, here we are almost into March; a new year for sharing books on the Revolutionary War period of our history. Hopefully, you will find these suggested readings helpful in your study and for your edification.

The month of March brings this little book "From the Historian's Bookshelf entitled: "Soldier of the 1775 American Revolution: A visual reference", by Denis Hambuchen and Bill Payson, The Countryman Press, Woodstock, VT 05091,2011.

In 1775, at the beginning of the American War of Independence, the men that stood up to the British Regulars were farmers, laborers and artisans. Most had procured their own weapons and fought without pay against overwhelming odds. This book affords a glimpse into the day-to-day conditions of an average soldier through a collection of artifacts and exacting reproductions.

If you are at all interested in what our ancestors wore, the accoutrements they carried, and weapons they used, this book has excellent pictures and descriptions. It will be on display at our March meeting, so pick it up and take a look
