# Williamsburg Chapter Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution



By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

#### **Historians Corner**

The month of September brings another "summer read" selection "From the Historian's Bookshelf". This one is entitled A Narrative of a Revolutionary Soldier: Some of the Adventures, Dangers, and Sufferings of Joseph Plumb Martin. (The Memoir Previously Published as Private Yankee Doodle), With an Introduction by Thomas Fleming and a New Afterword by William Chad Stanley; Signet Classics, 2001, 2010.

The Declaration of Independence is barely a year old--- and a motley band of farmers and city fellows, beggars and gentlemen makes up the army of a new born country. Here Joseph Plumb Martin, a private in the Continental Army of the Revolutionary War, narrates his adventures as one of them. With neither horses nor uniforms, little food and less lodging, Martin and his fellows feed off the taste of freedom and warm themselves only with the prospect of independence and the shirts on their backs. Martin and his comrades traverse the mid-Atlantic colonies, from Connecticut over to Pennsylvania and back down through Delaware.

Although his story is more than two hundred years old, Martin's experiences mirror those of every soldier--- and give us a rare glimpse of the earthly beginnings of a nation's history in a compelling memoir of hardship and war.
