# Williamsburg Chapter Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution



By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

#### Historian's Corner

September's selection "From the Historian's Bookshelf" is entitled "A Cheerful & Comfortable Faith: Anglican Religious Practice in the Elite Households of Eighteenth-Century Virginia" by Lauren F. Winner, Yale University Press, New Haven, 2010.

This enlightening book examines the physical objects in elite Virginia households of the eighteenth century to discover what they can tell us about their owners' lives and religious practices. Lauren F. Winner looks closely at punchbowls, needlework, mourning jewelry, baptismal gowns, biscuit molds, cookbooks, and many other items, illuminating the ways Anglicanism influenced daily activities in colonial Virginia, particularly in the households of the gentry.

How did people pray? How were they baptized? Why were they baptized at home? Why were controversies over baptism so

heated? What was religious education for girls like? How did cookbooks influence religious feasting and fasting? The answer to these and other questions extend our understanding of early American religion beyond the flash and fire of Puritanism and evangelicalism.
