By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

Historian's Corner

The October selection "From the Historian's Bookshelf" is entitled "Patrick Henry: Patriot & Statesman", by Norine Dickson Campbell, The Devin-Adair Company, Old Greenwich, Connecticut, 1969.

The Patrick Henry known to few Americans stands larger than life on the stage of our history. Only within the past several decades have historians begun to recognize that here was only one of the truly extraordinary men who lived and worked in that extraordinary time when the United States was emerging from the chaos of revolution. Most people only know of the Patrick Henry as the fiery orator of "Give me liberty or give me death" fame.

Norine Dickson Campbell is one of those who recognized Henry's importance in pre and post Revolution history, and has dedicated much of her life to studying his career in the context of his time. Her research and devotion have culminated in this authentic, warmly written account of the eminent Virginian.

This is an appropriate book for October in light of the fact that the guest speaker at our chapter meeting will be "Patrick Henry" (aka) Richard Schumann of Colonial Williamsburg.
