By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

### Crossing of the Dan Commemoration

On Saturday February 22 (Washington's Birthday) Chapter President Bob Spencer, Jack Lee and Ed Truslow journeyed to South Boston, VA to participate in the 233<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary Commemoration of The Crossing of the Dan. In February of 1781 General Nathaniel Greene's forces escaped destruction by crossing the Dan River with the only available boats thereby leaving the British with no way to pursue them. General Greene, after being resupplied and augmented with additional troops was able to later recross the river to inflict heavy casualties on General Cornwallis' forces at The Battle Guilford Courthouse in North Carolina.


