Edward Truslow, President, VASSAR 2016



Williamsburg Chapter's Past President, Edward Truslow, was elected president of the Virginia Society, Sons of the American Revolution, at the February annual meeting in Richmond, Virginia. Ed's selection comes after serving as Chapter Vice President from 2009 to 2011 and President from 2011-2013 and holding a variety of state offices, the last of which was First Vice President in 2015. He announced in his acceptance remarks that he will promote four presidential initiatives for the Society: the Blandford Cemetery Memorial Dedication; emphasizing presentation of SAR War and Military Service Medals; encouraging SAR presentations to local civic organizations, and donations to the Museum of the American Revolution at Yorktown. Ed will preside over the September semi-annual Virginia society meeting to be held in Williamsburg. Ed is a 12th generation Virginian, born in Harrisonburg and grew up in Winchester. His father descended from a long line of Truslows that came from England to Stafford County in the mid-18th century.

His mother's line descends from early German settlers in the Shenandoah Valley and Puritans who settled in Massachusetts.

Obtaining an undergraduate and graduate degree on Long Island, he was employed as an engineer with Grumman Aerospace Corporation, later Northrup-Grumman, in Bethpage, New York, for 41 years. Early in his career he worked on the Lunar Module program, later serving as operations project engineer on the Navy's A-6E Intruder and E2C Hawkeye aircraft. He and his wife, Laura, who have two daughters, moved from Huntington, New York to Williamsburg in 2007.

Rufus Weaver, a member of Samuel Harrick's Regiment of Vermont militia, is Ed's primary ancestor. However, research has identified many more ancestors who fought for liberty in the Revolutionary War. Benjamin Truslow Sr., Abraham Beydler and Jacob Stickley were soldiers in the Virginia militia. Dr. George Keller is credited with rendering aid to colonial forces; Lawrence Snapp and Leonard Bath furnished supplies, and Johann Kopp was a soldier in the Lancaster, County, Pennsylvania militia.

The Semi-Annual Meeting of the Virginia Society will be in Williamsburg on September 16-17. A host-chapter committee has been formed. Its chairman is Jack Lee, our Chapter Treasurer.
