




5537 Centerville Rd. The entrance is at the stoplight of the intersection of Centerville Rd and Longhill Rd.

The Williamsburg Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution will conduct a Memorial Service at Freedom Park on Tuesday, June 26 in honor of the valiant American Patriots who gave their lives in the Battle of Spencer's Ordinary on that day in 1781. The Memorial Service will take place at 10 a.m. Shirt and slacks are the appropriate attire for the service.

A series of skirmishes occurred in the woods and meadows of Freedom Park between units of Lord Cornwallis and those of the French general, Marquis de Lafayette.





A free pocket pamphlet on the Constitution, The Bill of Rights and Our Declaration of Independence will be available to those members or guests desiring one at our SAR Luncheon meetings.

General Wayne crossed the Potomac with his brigade of 700 Pennsylvania troops on May 31, 1781 at Noland's Ferry in Loudoun County and marched through Leesburg on June 3, 1781. General Wayne's troops provided the critical reinforcements for Lafayette's army in Virginia, which had been in retreat from the larger army of Cornwallis prior to his arrival. Wayne's troops joined Lafayette on June 10th and by mid-June, Cornwallis had turned his army toward the Virginia coast. General Wayne, leading the advanced forces of Lafayette's army and augmented by 200 Virginia riflemen, engaged Cornwallis at the Battle of Green Spring on July 6th as Cornwallis prepared to make the difficult crossing of the James River. The Battle of Green Spring was the largest infantry engagement to occur in Virginia during the war, leading to the withdrawal of Cornwallis to Yorktown and the end of the war a few months later.


Bruton Parish Church will be the scene of the 33rd Annual Service of Prayer & Thanksgiving to recognize the importance of July 4th in our country's history. Sponsored by the Williamsburg Chapter, SAR, and in cooperation with the Bruton Parish Church, the ceremony begins at 9 a.m.; parking is allowed on Duke of Gloucester Street.

Following the ceremony at the Church, many SAR members will drive out Route #5 to Berkeley Plantation to attend the Williamsburg Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, annual commemorative wreath laying ceremony at the grave site of Benjamin Harrison. A pot luck luncheon will be served following the ceremonies.

Colonial Williamsburg has scheduled an Independence Day Band Concert on the lawn of the DeWitt-Wallace Museum in late afternoon, followed by the annual, spectacular fireworks display to close out the day's celebrations. Williamsburg Chapter, SAR, will be distributing miniature American flags at the band concert.

A reminder also: on July 6, Williamsburg Chapter, SAR, will lay a wreath at the site of the Battle of Greenspring at a brief, early morning ceremony. A monument is located at the Church on the Main near Jamestown.

Geo. Washington's Commission

Commander in Chief of the Continental Army

17 June 1775 IN CONGRESS



The delegates of the United Colonies of New Hampshire, Massachusetts bay, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pensylvania, the Counties of New-Castle, Kent, and Sussex, on Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, and South Carolina: To George Washington, Esq.

WE, reposing special trust and confidence in your patriotism, valor, conduct, and fidelity, do, by these presents, constitute and appoint you to be General and Commander in chief, of the army of the United Colonies, and of all the forces now raised, or to be raised, by them, and of all others who shall voluntarily offer their service, and join the said Army for the Defence of American liberty, and for repelling every hostile invasion thereof: And you are hereby vested with full power and authority to act as you shall think for the good and welfare of the service.

And we do hereby strictly charge and require all Officers and Soldiers, under your command, to be obedient to your orders, and diligent in the exercise of their several duties.

And we do also enjoin and require you, to be careful in executing the great trust reposed in you, by causing strict discipline and order to be observed in the army, and that the soldiers be duly exercised, and provided with all convenient necessaries.

And you are to regulate your conduct in every respect by the rules and discipline of war, (as herewith given you,) and punctually to observe and follow such orders and directions, from time to time, as you shall receive from this, or a future Congress of these United Colonies, or committee of Congress.

This commission to continue in force, until revoked by this, or a future Congress.

By order of the Congress.

Dated, Philadelphia, June 17, 1775.


RECISTRAR'S CORNER

In late Winter and early Spring this year, there was for me a long period of registrar inactivity. Now the opposite. A flurry of applications, which is good. For any of our members conversing with interested parties, be sure they have a copy of their birth certificate that names their parents. It is also hoped that they can produce birth, marriage (and death, if applicable) certificates for their parents and grandparents. A certificate is of little value if it does not prove a linkage to another generation or to another branch of the family in the lineage. A newspaper reference (including obituaries) must provide the name of the newspaper, date and page number.

HELP WANTED CORNER

JUNE GUEST SPEAKER

Dr. Charles P. Neimeyer recently retired as the Director of the Marine Corps History Division and Gray Research Center at Marine Corps University. During his professional career, Dr. Neimeyer served as a Marine Corps officer from 1976 to 1996 retiring at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. While on active duty, Dr. Neimeyer served in all three active duty Marine Corps Divisions and earned a doctorate degree (with honors) from Georgetown University and began a second career in professional military education in 1997. From 1997 to 2002, he was an award winning-professor of national security affairs at the U.S. Naval War College and served his last two years there as the Dean of Academics. After a stint as a Vice President at Valley Forge Military Academy & College, in 2006, he was appointed by MGEN Donald Gardner, USMC (ret.), then President of the Marine Corps University to be the next Director of Marine Corps History. He held this position for the next 11 years. Upon retirement, he received the Secretary of the Navy's Distinguished Civilian Service Award and the General Leonard F. Chapman Medallion from the Marine Corps University Foundation. Dr. Neimeyer is the author of numerous articles and books related to history and national security affairs. His most recent publication, War in the Chesapeake: The British Campaigns to Control the Bay, 1813-1814, (US Naval Institute, 2015), won the Simmons-Shaw Award for best history by a federal historian in 2016. He is married to Janet Louise Bell of Bethesda, Maryland and they have three children.


June 9th Luncheon Meeting


